School Day Timings: Please can I ask that everyone is on time bringing children in at the beginning of the day and collecting them. Learning begins promptly and it can be very disruptive to our pupils when they are disturbed by latecomers. Pupils are collected from the school buses at 8.45 and everyone coming in with parents and carers should be here at 9am. If your child is not going to be in school please phone the school office before 9.15am and if you can let us know of any appointments in advance that is really helpful. We would always encourage that any holidays are not taken during term time. We don't want our pupils missing out on all the exciting learning and experiences they have in school.
