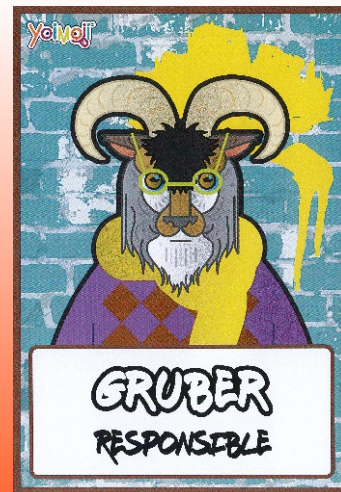
Headteacher's Award Winners
